

BYLAW No. 8/97

A BYLAW RESPECTING THE TRENCHING OF WATER TO AND IN MUNICIPAL ROAD DITCHES, BREAKING, FILLING, INJURING, ENCUMBERING AND OBSTRUCTING OF MUNICIPAL ROADS AND ROAD ALLOWANCES.

Whereas, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Prairie Rose #309 is concerned about the safety of the general public and whereas, the Council believes that the excavation of ground along roadways for water drainage or any other purposes is dangerous to the public when not properly constructed.

Now therefore, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Prairie Rose No. 309, in the Province of Saskatchewan, pursuant to Section 206 (2) (i) and (j) of the RM Act 1989, enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw:
 - a) "municipal road" means any public highway that is under the direction, management and control of the rural municipality.
 - b) "rural municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Prairie Rose No. 309.
2. No person shall trench, cut, fill or otherwise injure a municipal road or portion thereof or other public place in the rural municipality except by written authority of the council.
3. No person shall destroy or remove vegetation from any road allowance in the municipality except by written authority of the council.
4. No person shall encumber or obstruct a road in the municipality by leaving a vehicle, or other article or thing standing thereon.
5. The Council shall have the authority to order any unauthorized work be returned to the original condition. If the order is not complied within fourteen days the council is authorized to perform the work at the expense of the owner of the land and any unpaid charges may be added to the taxes.
6. Any person who contravenes the provisions of the bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties imposed in the General Penalty Bylaw of this rural municipality.
